The response is as follows:

QUESTION: I was wondering if the minister could tell me how many ELL students are currently in public schools — whether they are elementary schools and high schools. Maybe if it's not too much, if there is a breakdown — for example, I would imagine there are probably more in the Catholic school stream than there would be in the public school stream.

ANSWER: As of the Fall, 2016 the department supported 149 ELL students in our schools (81 in elementary schools, 68 in secondary schools).

The department is projecting that as of the end of this school year we will be supporting 191 ELL students in our schools (116 in elementary schools, 75 in secondary schools).

The following schools have been provided with additional resources to support their ELL students: Christ the King Elementary; Vanier Catholic Secondary; Selkirk Street School; F.H. Collins; Ecole Emilie Tremblay; Porter Creek Secondary; Del van Gorder; Robert Service; St. Elias Community School, Grey Mountain School; Jack Hulland Elementary; Holy Family Elementary; Johnson Elementary; Golden Horn Elementary; Watson Lake Secondary.
