Ms. Hanson, Leader of the Third Party

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to fulfill its election commitment and immediately appoint a non-partisan commission on electoral reform to engage and collaborate with Yukoners in order to:

- (1) propose the best system to replace the first-past-the-post voting system, including consideration of proportional representation;
- (2) consider fixed election dates;
- (3) consider legislative amendments in order that voters have the final say when a Member of the Legislative Assembly changes caucus affiliation after being elected; and
- (4) consider banning corporate, union and Outside contributions to Yukon political parties.

2. Motion No. 209

Ms. Hanson, Leader of the Third Party

THAT this House urges the Minister of Highways and Public Works to ensure that the *Canadian Free Trade Agreement* exemption that allows the Government of Yukon to reserve up to \$10 million-worth of contracts for local businesses is used to its full extent for the 2017-18 fiscal year.
